

## June 2010 NEET and Not Known Cohort Analysis

The data contained within this report has been compiled from the Connexions South London Client Caseload Information System (CCIS) Management Information return for June 2010.

The Report provides an analysis of young people aged 16-18 and 19 years within the NEET group, detailed by the following categories :

- Gender
- Age
- Support Level
- Ethnic Origin
- Vulnerable Group Characteristics
- Top 25 Wards
- Not Known

The 16-18 NEET Group has also been analysed to show the following :

- Availability to the Labour Market
- Non availability to the Labour Market
- NEET Joiners & leavers

## Overall

### 16-18

The Adjusted NEET figure for ages 16-18 in Bromley in June 2010 is 4.2%, which shows a 0.1% increase from May 2010. The actual number of NEET young people within Bromley is 313, which is an increase of 3 young people from the May 2010 total of 310. The Not Known percentage for Bromley in June 2010 for this age range is 3.6% or 321 young people. This percentage shows no change from May 2010, where 327 young people were Not Known.

### 19 Year Olds

The Adjusted NEET figure for 19 year olds in Bromley in June 2010 is 5.5%, which is a 0.3% decrease from May 2010. The actual number of NEET young people within Bromley is 78 which shows a decrease in 17 young people from the May 2010 total of 95. The Not Known percentage for 19 year olds in Bromley in June 2010 is 18.1% or 625 young people. This percentage is an increase of 0.4% from May 2010 where 607 young people were Not Known.

## Gender, Age & Support Level

### 16-18

The 16-18 NEET totals for females in Bromley are lower than their male counterpart, with 153 (48.9%) compared to 160 (51.1%) young people respectively. The majority of 16-18 NEET are 17 (53%) and 18 (39.3%) years old. There were only 24 (7.7%) young people who were 16 years old and NEET in June 2010. The majority of NEET in this age range were described as having a support level of "Supported" or "Minimum", with totals of 147 (47%) and 102 (32.6%) each. Only 20.5% (64) of 16-18 year old NEET were classified as having "Intensive" needs.

### 19 Year Olds

The 19 year old NEET in Bromley are distributed contrastingly for gender, with totals of 47(60.3%) and 31 (39.7%) for female and male young people respectively. The majority of NEET in this age range were described as having a support level of "Supported" with a total of 33 (42.3%).

## Ethnicity

### 16-18

The majority of 16-18 NEET in Bromley in June 2010 have an ethnic group of White, with 267 young people (85.3%). The other largest totals are from the Black and Mixed ethnic groups with 18 (5.8%) and 17 (5.4%) respectively. The other ethnic groups make up 3.5% (11) of the NEET young people in this age range.

### 19 Year Olds

The majority of 19 year old NEET in Bromley in June 2010 have an ethnic group of White with 64 young people (82.1%). The other largest totals are from the Mixed and Black ethnic group which have 5 (6.4%) and 6 (7.7%) of the total NEET group respectively this month. The remaining ethnic groups make up 3.9% (3) of the NEET young people in this age range.

## Vulnerable Groups

### 16-18

The highest total of NEET young people in Bromley having a vulnerable group characteristic in June 2010 are those described as being Supervised by YOTS and Teenage mothers with 6.1% (19) and 8.3% (26). The other largest vulnerable group of NEET young people in this age range are those described as having LDD with 15 (4.8%) young people respectively.

### 19 Year Olds

The highest total of NEET young people aged 19 years old having a vulnerable group characteristic are those described as Teenage mothers with 23.1% (18). The other largest vulnerable group of 19 year old NEET are those described as having LDD with 14 (18%) young people.

## 16-18 NEET Availability

### Available

In June 2010 83.1% of the total 16-18 NEET group are available to the labour market. Within this available group, 202 (77.7%) are described as seeking employment, education and training. The other significant percentages are 8.5% (22) and 5% (13) for those young people described as NEET awaiting level 2 and Other PDOs respectively.

### Not Available

In June 2010 16.9% of the total 16-18 NEET group are not available to the labour market. Within this unavailable group, 36 (67.9%) are described as NEET Teenage parents. The other significant totals are 15.1% (8) for both those classified as NEET illness and NEET pregnancy.

## NEET Joiners & Leavers

### Joiners

Of the 41 young people who joined the Bromley NEET group in June 2010, 24.4% (10) are from education and 12.2% (5) are from employment. The other largest destination type is from Currency re-established destinations with 26.8% (11) of the total young people joining the NEET group this month.

### Leavers

Of the 30 young people who left the Bromley NEET group in June 2010, 3.3% (1) are going to education and 23.3% (7) are going to employment. The other largest percentage of the NEET leavers this month entered the Currency Expired group which make up 36.7% (11) of the total young people leaving NEET.

## NEET Ward Analysis

### 16-18

The largest number of 16-18 NEET in Bromley in June 2010 are from the wards of Cray Valley West and Cray Valley East with 39 (12.5%) and 33 (10.5%) of the total NEET group respectively.

### 19 Year Olds

The largest numbers of 19 year old NEET in Bromley in June 2010 are from the Cray Valley East ward with 14.1% (11) of the total NEET group respectively.

## Not Known Analysis

### 16-18

The largest proportion of the 321 young people described as Not Known have expired destination currencies with 66.4% (213). The other largest percentage are those with destinations described as Current Situation Not Known with 30.8% (99).

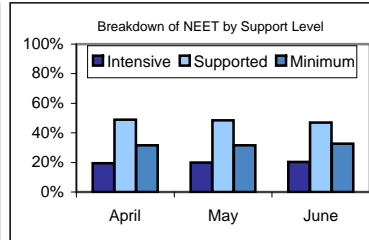
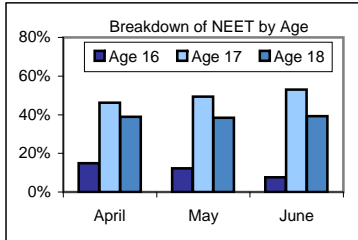
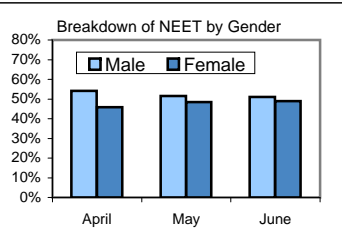
### 19 Year Olds

The breakdown of the 625 Not Known for the 19 year olds in Bromley in June show the largest proportion have expired destination currencies with 85.8% (536). The other largest percentage are those with destinations described as current situation not known with 13.4% (84).

### NEET Aged 16-18

The Adjusted NEET Figure is 4.2% (367 Adj).

The unadjusted NEET Total is 313 and the Not Known is 3.63% (321)

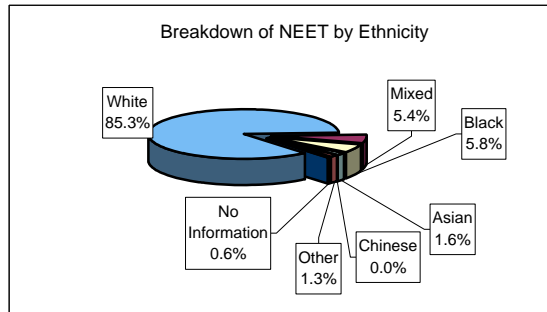

## Monthly NEET and Not Known Cohort Analysis

### Definitions

#### 1 Introduction

- 1.1 The data within this report has been compiled from the Connexions South London Client Caseload Information Systems Management Information return to the Department for Education for 2010/11.

#### 2 Definitions

- 2.1 The Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) cohort is defined by the following destinations:

- Any unemployed category
- Personal Development Opportunity
- Personal Development Opportunity – Waged
- Supporting Family Young Carer
- Supporting Family – Teenage Parent
- Not Available - Illness
- Pregnancy – (11 weeks to due date)
- Not Available - Religious or Cultural grounds
- Never Economically Active
- Voluntary work
- New Deal Gateway
- Not available - Other reason

## 2.2 The Not Known cohort is defined by the following destinations:

- Current situation Not Known
- Cannot be contacted
- Refused to provide information
- Currency expired

## 2.3 The Vulnerable group categories are defined as the follow target groups:

- LDD
- Teenage Parent
- Pregnancy
- Supervised by YOTS
- Care Leaver
- Substance misuse
- Young Carer
- Refugee/Asylum Seeker
- Teenage Father
- Looked After/In Care

## 2.4 The NEET adjusted percentage and numbers are calculated using the following formula:

- DfE research determined that from those who lapsed from EET 92% were likely to still be EET and so the remaining 8% would be counted as NEET. For those who had lapsed from NEET, 58% were likely to have re-joined NEET and so the remaining 42% would be EET.
- This calculation is then applied to those who have lapsed to produce the adjusted NEET percentage.
- The adjusted lapsed figures are added back into the EET and NEET cohorts, the numbers are re-calculated (NEET/EET + NEET).
