

June 2010 NEET and Not Known Cohort Analysis

The data contained within this report has been compiled from the Connexions South London Client Caseload Information System (CCIS) Management Information return for June 2010.

The Report provides an analysis of young people aged 16-18 and 19 years within the NEET group, detailed by the following categories :

- Gender
- Age
- Support Level
- Ethnic Origin
- Vulnerable Group Characteristics
- Top 25 Wards
- Not Known

The 16-18 NEET Group has also been analysed to show the following :

- Availability to the Labour Market
- Non availability to the Labour Market
- NEET Joiners & leavers

Overall

16-18

The Adjusted NEET figure for ages 16-18 in Croydon in June 2010 is 7.6%, which shows is a 0.5% increase from May 2010. The actual number of NEET young people within Croydon is 493, which is an increase in 36 young people from the June 2010 total of 457. The Not Known percentage for Croydon in June 2010 for this age range is 6.5% or 504 young people. This is down from May 2010, where 566 (7%) young people were Not Known.

19 Year Olds

The Adjusted NEET figure for 19 year olds in Croydon in June 2010 is 7.2%, which is an increase of 0.5% from May 2010. The actual number of NEET young people within Croydon is 172 which is an increase in 40 young people from the May 2010 total of 132. The Not Known percentage for 19 year olds in Croydon in June 2010 is 16.8% or 629 young people. This is a decrease of 1.2% from May 2010 where 673 young people were Not Known.

Gender, Age & Support Level

16-18

The 16-18 NEET totals for males in Croydon are higher than their female counterpart, with 262 (53.1%) compared to 231 (46.9%) young people respectively. The majority of 16-18 NEET are 17 (52.5%) and 18 (38.5%) years old. 16 year olds make up only 8.9% (44) of the total NEET cohort for June. The majority of NEET in this age range were described as having a support level of "Supported" or "Minimum", with totals of 223 (45.2%) and 228 (46.3%) each. Only 8.5% (42) of 16-18 year old NEET were classified as having "Intensive" needs.

19 Year Olds

The 19 year old NEET in Croydon are distributed contrastingly as 16-18 for gender, with totals of 80 (46.5%) and 92 (53.5%) for male and female young people respectively. The majority of NEET in this age range were described as having a support level of "Supported" or "Minimum", with totals of 81 (47.1%) and 73 (42.4%) each. The remaining 18 (10.5%) of 19 year old NEET were classified as having "Intensive" needs.

Ethnicity

16-18

The majority of 16-18 NEET in Croydon in June 2010 have an ethnic group of White, with 303 young people (61.5%). The other largest totals are from the Black and Mixed ethnic groups with 92 (18.7%) and 63 (12.8%) respectively. The other ethnic groups make up 7.1% (35) of the NEET young people in this age range.

19 Year Olds

The majority of 19 year old NEET in Croydon in June 2010 have an ethnic group of White with 103 young people (59.9%). The other largest totals are from the Black and Mixed ethnic group with 29 (16.9%) and 21 (12.2%) respectively. The remaining ethnic groups make up 11.1% (19) of the NEET young people in this age range.

Vulnerable Groups

16-18

The highest total of NEET young people in Croydon having a vulnerable group characteristic in June 2010 are those described as Supervised by YOT and Teenage mothers with 8.3% (41) and 9.1% (45) respectively. The other largest vulnerable group of NEET young people in this age range are those described as having LDD with 7.5% (37).

19 Year Olds

The highest total of 19 year old NEET young people in Croydon having a vulnerable group characteristic in June 2010 are those described as Teenage Mothers with 20.9% (36). The other largest vulnerable group of NEET young people in this age range are those described as being Pregnant with 8.1% (14).

16-18 NEET Availability

Available

In June 2010 86.4% of the total 16-18 NEET group are available to the labour market. Within this available group, 378 (88.7%) are described as seeking employment, education and training. The other significant percentages are 4.9% (21) and 2.4% (10) for those described as NEET other PDOs and NEET Not yet ready for work or learning respectively.

Not Available

In June 2010 13.6% of the total 16-18 NEET group are not available to the labour market. Within this unavailable group, 47 (70.2%) are described as NEET Teenage parents. The other significant totals are 16.4% (11) for those classified as NEET illness and 10.5% (7) for NEET pregnancy.

NEET Joiners & Leavers

Joiners

Of the 120 young people who joined the Croydon NEET group in June 2010, 16.7% (20) are from education and 6.7% (8) are from employment. The other largest destination type are from currency re-established destinations with 48.3% (58) of the total young people joining the NEET group this month.

Leavers

Of the 67 young people who left the Croydon NEET group in June 2010, 1.5% (1) are going to education and 17.9% (12) are going to employment. The other largest percentage of the NEET leavers this month entered the Currency expired group which make up 55.2% (37) of the total young people leaving NEET.

NEET Ward Analysis

16-18

The largest number of 16-18 NEET in Croydon in June 2010 are from the ward of Fieldway with 9.9% (49) of the total NEET group. The other largest totals are from Woodside and Selhurst wards each with 7.1% (35) of the total NEET Group.

19 Year Olds

The largest numbers of 19 year old NEET in Croydon in June 2010 are from Woodside ward with 9.3% (16) of the total NEET group respectively.

Not Known Analysis

16-18

The largest proportion of the 504 young people described as being Not Known are those having expired destinations with 44.3% (223). The other largest percentage are those with destinations described as unknowns destinations with 34.3% (173).

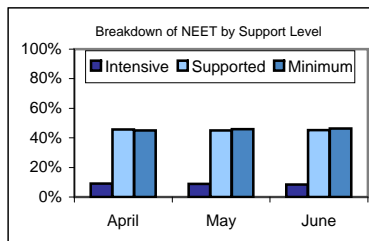
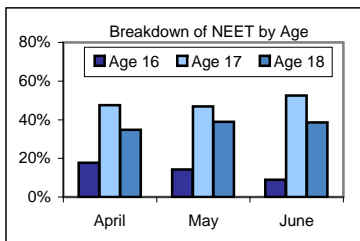
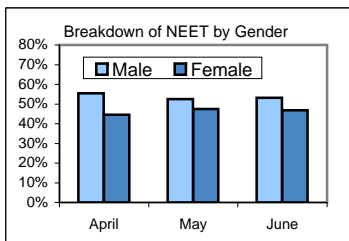
19 Year Olds

The breakdown of the 629 Not Known for the 19 year olds in Croydon in June show the largest proportion have expired destination currencies with 62% (390). The other largest percentage are those with destinations described as cannot be contacted with 20.4% (128).

Definitions

1 Introduction

- 1.1 The data within this report has been compiled from the Connexions South London Client Caseload Information Systems Management Information return to the Department for Education for 2010/11.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET) cohort is defined by the following destinations:

- Any unemployed category
- Personal Development Opportunity
- Personal Development Opportunity – Waged
- Supporting Family Young Carer
- Supporting Family – Teenage Parent
- Not Available - Illness
- Pregnancy – (11 weeks to due date)
- Not Available - Religious or Cultural grounds
- Never Economically Active
- Voluntary work
- New Deal Gateway
- Not available - Other reason

2.2 The Not Known cohort is defined by the following destinations:

- Current situation Not Known
- Cannot be contacted
- Refused to provide information
- Currency expired

2.3 The Vulnerable group categories are defined as the follow target groups:

- LDD
- Teenage Parent
- Pregnancy
- Supervised by YOTS
- Care Leaver
- Substance misuse
- Young Carer
- Refugee/Asylum Seeker
- Teenage Father
- Looked After/In Care

2.4 The NEET adjusted percentage and numbers are calculated using the following formula:

- DfE research determined that from those who lapsed from EET 92% were likely to still be EET and so the remaining 8% would be counted as NEET. For those who had lapsed from NEET, 58% were likely to have re-joined NEET and so the remaining 42% would be EET.
- This calculation is then applied to those who have lapsed to produce the adjusted NEET percentage.
- The adjusted lapsed figures are added back into the EET and NEET cohorts, the numbers are re-calculated (NEET/EET + NEET).
